Reflection:

The students were motivated because of the related theme and learning activities. The theme was related to their daily life so that they could engage in the lesson easily. The use of iPad Apps for learning and writing riddles on lanterns could arouse students' interest in learning. Also, students felt interested in writing riddles about their teachers and they loved guessing who their classmates wrote about. They even spent a lot of spare time in recess to read their friends' riddles. This helped create a self-learning activity for them. Moreover, the use of e-learning could help the teacher assess students' learning and provide instant feedback. Thus, I think that this lesson is a success in terms of **motivation**, **self-learning** and **assessment**.
